

Special Filming Conditions BURTON CHACE PARK

The Special Filming Conditions described below will be included in the terms and conditions of permits issued for filming in this area and are in addition to the standard terms and conditions applicable to filming permits generally. While these Special Filming Conditions will be included as terms if a permit for filming in this area is issued, they are not intended to, and do not, establish the criteria or standards for determining whether or not a particular permit (or permits) will be issued for this area. The decision whether or not a particular permit (or permits) will be issued is vested in the discretion of the appropriate City or County department or their designees (including FilmL.A., Inc), to be exercised consistent with public health, safety and general welfare, and applicable land-use ordinances.

These conditions have been drafted by the Los County Department of Beaches & Harbors to help facilitate filming in the unincorporated area of Marina del Rey in the County of Los Angeles.

- For inquiries about park or dock availability for filming call (424) 526-7910. A walk-thru with Park Supervisor (424) 526-7902 must be performed. All filming information, including prep & strike, must be provided at the time of walk-thru.
- No filming on weekends in Summer Season (June - September), nor weekends in December.
- Wednesday(s) limited to still-photography due to landscaping service schedule.
- No catering on park property. Craft services allowed if it falls within the allotted vehicles.
- Must adhere to 5 mph speed limit.
- No structure altering activity. No exceptions.
- Use of guest docks, picnic shelters, pergolas, and Community Room require approval from DBH and an additional fee.
- Cables guards must be used whenever cables cross a walking path or access road.
- No parking or staging in red cul-da-sac area.
- No filming, blocking or parking on access ramps or storm drains.
- No vehicles or other equipment on turf, unless otherwise approved by DBH.
- Must obtain prior approval from DBH to place vehicle and equipment on pedestrian walkway. Vehicles and equipment must be able to move in the event of an emergency.
- No production vehicles allowed in Burton Chace Park's metered parking lot. Maximum of ten (10) production vehicles allowed in adjacent lot #77; must pay and display receipts. Base camp and additional parking can be arranged for lot #2.
- May not block emergency access road. One lane of the Park's emergency access road must be kept open at all times.
- Emergency road spike unit may not be covered. These spikes will only be lowered by DBH parking unit and not prior to 7:30 a.m.
- Only equipment trucks and cars needed for filming, and covered by film company insurance, are allowed in the park. This includes private vehicles of Los Angeles County personnel assigned to the production company.
- Only the following production vehicles are allowed in the park: 1 generator, 2 cast vehicles (max), 2 stake beds, and 1 camera truck. No dressing room trailers or other similar facilities on park grounds. They may only be stationed in area adjacent to Helmsman statue and the half circular area adjacent to the SMWYC. No production vehicles over 5 tons or longer than 35 feet are permitted in the park.
- L.A. County Sheriff is required for all film production. A Sheriff is not required for still photography. To schedule a Sheriff, contact Marsha Townsend at (323) 267-4814.
- DBH staff assigned to location will open arm-gate at start of activity. Production will be required to provide arm-gate attendant.
- Production companies filming on a dock or a boat in the Marina will be required to have an L.A. County Lifeguard for the entire time of dock usage. Lifeguards are on a 4-hour minimum.
- No equipment, cables or production vehicles may be left in park overnight without prior approval from DBH. Company must provide security guard.
- Must adhere to FilmL.A. permitted hours, approved by Los Angeles County Beaches and Harbor. No filming prior to 6:00 am and must vacate park by 10:00pm.
- All vehicles or equipment over 1,500 pounds must remain 15 feet from seawall.
